I. ESSER Review – Pawlukiewicz

Kimberly Pawlukiewicz, Director of State and Federal Programs, presented a PowerPoint on the Extended Covid-19 Learning Plan and Continuity of Services Plan Review.

Ms. Pawlukiewicz shared that ESSER requires that the district review the Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan (eCOL) and Continuity of Services Plan (COS) within six months of receiving the funds.

The eCol plan allowed students to be in learning environments that suited the needs of the district and families and required that 50% or more of the district's students will have met their reading and math growth goals.

The COS plan requires the district to outline how the ESSER funds are used to support students, families and the district. The COS plan was to be used for mitigation strategies, academic impact, and additional needs such as technology, mental health and instruction improvements. This plan will be reviewed every six months.

I. Finance Committee Report – May

The Finance Committee Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Wayne-Westland Community Schools was held Thursday, September 8, 2022 beginning at 4:30 pm via the Zoom platform.

Mr. Spisak shared that the district was looking to purchase four replacement plow vehicles. This will be through the Oakland County Consortium Bid pricing. It is allocated in the Maintenance and Operations general fund budget.

Mr. VanderZee stated that the district would like to upgrade our two-way radio communications across the district in our standard communication protocols and methods. Mr. VanderZee recommended that we proceed with Mobile Communications America (MCA).

Mr. VanderZee stated that they are recommending Moss Telecommunications to purchase the sound systems for the two high schools, John Glenn and Wayne Memorial.

Mrs. Cleaves shared both the investment report and the monthly check register.

161.23 SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT/COMMENTS – Dignan

Dr. Dignan thanked the pledge students and Ms. Pawlukiewicz for her ESSER presentation.

Dr. Dignan also shared the following comments from a prepared statement:

We want to thank the WWCS family for a great launch to the year.

We hosted the KLAA Student Leadership Conference at the WDF Career-Tech Center today from 9:30 am - 1 pm. Each school was encouraged to bring 10 student-athletes.

The Elementary Flag & Cheer season kicked off. I want to thank Mr. Schulte and others that had a hand in setting up the logistics. This has been a great experience for our kids and families.

High School Afterschool Meal Program: We launched our Afterschool Meal Program where we will serve hot meals to students at the Wayne Memorial and John Glenn High Schools participating in afterschool activities. We will provide an afterschool bus this fall, so all students have access to after-school activities and tutoring.

We are feeding 150 students at Hicks Elementary through Blessings in a Backpack this year. Blessings in a Backpack mobilizes communities, individuals, and resources to provide weekend food for school-aged children across our district who might otherwise go hungry. Every student needs the nourishment needed to learn and grow. Blessings in a Backpack strives to ensure children do not go hungry on the weekends by empowering individuals and communities to act.

JGHS Health Clinic: We have secured additional funding to offset the rising costs of construction through the Beaumont Foundation. They will cover over 200k of the rising cost of the construction. We are very grateful. We plan to unveil the JGHS Health Clinic in April 2023.

EMU Scholarship: We are launching EMU's Education First Opportunity Scholarship at Wayne-Westland Community Schools on all social media platforms. This is a free tuition scholarship for any student who qualifies for a Pell grant and has a 3.0 GPA or higher. EMU is waiving the testing requirement. Students must complete their FAFSA by February 15 to be eligible. This is the biggest scholarship in the district and can impact 85% of the student body.

WW & LTU Blue Devil Promise: Wayne-Westland Community Schools and Lawrence Technological University (LTU) have partnered together to offer 50 students coming from John Glenn High School, Wayne Memorial High School, and the William D. Ford Career-Technical Center the opportunity to earn an \$80,000 college scholarship to pursue a career in science, technology, engineering, arts, or math (STEAM).

K. May - thanked the pledge students and mentioned that the after-school meals at the high schools was a needed program.

T. Buckalew - thanked the pledge students and Mr. Tyler and Ms. Pawlukiewicz for the presentation. He was pleased that the sale of Tinkham had been finalized. He thanked Ms. Goble and commented that the TAG program is an outstanding program.

M. Hines – mentioned a scholarship opportunity and a Detroit Pistons partnership.

J. Albrecht - thanked the pledge students and Ms. Pawlukiewicz for her to-the-point presentation. He expressed that many good things are happening in the district and encouraged the community to reach out to principals and learn about them.

F. Weaver – was thankful for the ongoing discussions about more security in our buildings and expressed that it is a top priority of the district to keep the students safe when they are in the buildings. He thanked Tony Spisak and his crew for all the work that they have done to ensure the safety of the students.

M. Neal – addressed the four snowplow trucks that were approved for purchase and the fact that they are replacing 15-17 years old trucks, and how frugal the district maintenance department has been to keep them running.

D. Cox – mentioned that on September 12, 2022 the Wayne-Westland Board of Education had a special meeting with the surrounding cities to discuss how we might share resources to create more student opportunities and safety issues. He mentioned that the board conducted a study session about safety and security at 6:00 p.m. before the board meeting; the meeting taking place on October 26, 2022 with Wayne-Westland, and the surrounding cities to approach school safety for students and employees. He commented that the school district is doing things to maintain a level of security, but the hope is that the district will look at the entire problem, put a system in place, and test it. The goal is to handle the issues before they become an emergency.

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
